## 3.1 sewing components of leather to form the whole garment

## 3.1.1 yoke

How to make yoke patterns for your clothes

"A yoke is a shaped pattern piece which forms part of a garment, usually fitting around the neck and shoulders, or around the hips to provide support for looser parts of the garment, such as a gathered skirt or the body of a shirt" – wikipedia. I cannot give a better explanation than this to a very important element which adds to the beauty of a garment be it a kid's dress or a night gown or even at the back of a shirt.

To make patterns of yokes we should first draft a front bodice pattern on paper; the most important marking here is the armhole depth – refer the table to mark this. This is a fitting armhole. If you want a more loose fit add 1/2 - 1 inch to it.



# Simple round yoke

Decide on the neckline of your choice. You can select any of the 60 plus neckline designs given in this post






On A-B mark point 2 such that E-2 = 3/4 inch;

From line G-E mark up 3/4 inch to point 1 on armhole line.

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Join the two points 1 & 2 in a soft curved line forming the lower line of the round yoke; cut out the yoke and the lower portion separately.

When you mark this pattern on the cloth **do not forget** to give 1/4 or 1/2 inch seam allowance.




If you want gathers on the lower part this can be drawn after the paper pattern is cut and separated into the yoke and the lower part

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# Full round yoke






Add the necessary seam allowance (1/4 inch or 1/2 inch ) when cutting from the cloth. If necessary add allowance for gathers in the lower bodice pattern.

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# Straight yoke





Mark point 1 on the line A-B such that A-1 = 6 or 7 inch


Draw a line straight from point 1 to the armhole 1-2


Cut along the line 1-2 in the paper pattern . Add the necessary seam allowance (1/4 inch or 1/2 inch ) when cutting from the cloth. If necessary add allowance for gathers in the lower bodice pattern.

## **Square Yoke Pattern**

This pattern can be styled in two ways – one starting from the shoulders and the other one starting from the armhole.

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Once the paper pattern for the dress is done on paper, mark point 1 such that F-1 = 5 inch (may take 4 inch for kids)

On the fold line mark a point 2 such that A-2 = 10 inch (for kids' dresses 7 inch)


Now mark point 3 such that 2-3 is 3 inch (for kids 2 inches)


Cut out the yoke pattern; add seam allowance of 1/4 or 1/2 inch

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
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Add the necessary seam allowance (1/4 inch or 1/2 inch) when cutting from the cloth. If necessary add allowance for gathers in the lower bodice pattern.



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## Pentagonal yoke pattern


Mark a point 1 on the armhole line 2 inches from line G-E

Mark 2 on line A-B such that A-2 = 10 inches

Add the necessary seam allowance (1/4 inch or 1/2 inch ) when cutting from the cloth. If necessary add allowance for gathers in the lower bodice pattern.

#### Side Yokes

Mark the neck depth as C-D



From D Mark 2 ½ inches to point 2

# From point G mark down 4 inches

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Draw a curved line touching points G-2-C

This is the side yoke line – add 1/4 or 1/2 inch seam allowance when cutting from fabric

This yoke should be cut out and sewn to the rest of the front bodice. Then it is finished the same way that the front bodice is finished

Sewing a Yoke to your bodice is described in the post on sewing a night dress

You can draft the neckline in different styles following the tutorial. Embellish it with some hand embroidery or some sashiko embroidery designs. Add a placket to the yoke by following this tutorial.

#### 3.1.2 cuff

#### Steps

Note: Prewash your fabric and tumble dry it until it is still slightly moist, dry in room temperature. Iron the fabric so it is easier to work


- 1. Once you have assembled your pattern (shoulder/side seams), turn the bottom raw edge of your sleeves 3/8" towards the wrong side and press.
- 2. Fold the remaining 2.5" of fabric towards the wrong side (the missing 1/8" is to account for the fold) and press
- 3. Starting at the underarm, stitch the first folded 3/8" to the sleeve 1/8" from the fold and remember to backstitch. Press again.
- 4. Fold the 2.5" in half toward the right side, just a little over the stitch line to hide it under the cuff and press

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5. In order to keep the cuff in place, stitch the cuff to the sleeve in the shoulder and underarm crease. Remember to backstitch.


## **3.1.3 sleeve**

- Trace the basic back pattern, transferring the shoulder dart to mid-armhole.
- Trace and cut the basic front pattern.




- Draw slash lines from mid-armhole and dart point to bust point.
- Slash to, not through, the bust point. Set aside until the back draft is complete.

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


- Mark 1/4 inch up from the shoulder tip.
- Place a ruler at mid-shoulder, touching the mark, and draw the length of the sleeve.
- Square a line one-half of the around-hand measurement.
- Draw a line to the armhole.
- Draw the under seam to the desired shape.
- Cut from the paper. Trace a second copy and mark the original shoulder tip as a guide.

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


- Lay the front pattern on top of the traced copy, and place a pushpin at the shoulder tip to the shoulder mark of the back pattern.
- Close the waist dart until the side waist touches the side waist of the back. (Release the bust point, if necessary.) Secure.




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- Trace the front pattern in red pencil from mid shoulder and to the side front waist.
   The sleeve is now a part of the front pattern. Remove pattern.
- Blend the front shoulderline to the mid-shoulder of the traced back pattern.
- · Cut around the front pattern and sleeve.
- Complete the pattern for a test fit.



- · Complete the front and back patterns.
- Mark notches at front and back shoulder tips.
- Draw the grainline and complete pattern for a test fit.

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#### 3.1.4 collar

The collar is a versatile design feature that will enhance the style of a garment. It is attached to the neckline of the garment and allows the size and shape of the neckline to vary. Collars come in all shapes and sizes and the most common are the stand up/mandarin, shirt, flat, sailor and lapel collar constructions.

Collars can be constructed in three basic ways. The first method is a right-angle construction, used for stand-up collars, shirt collars and small flat collars such as Peter Pan and Eton collars.

Secondly by joining the shoulders of the front and back bodice together to construct the collar directly on top of the bodice block. This technique is used to construct sailor collars and bigger versions of flat collars. The advantage of using this method is that the correct outer length of the collar construction results automatically, however large the collar or neckline extension is. Finally, the lapel construction, which is extended from the centre front, from the breaking point toward the shoulder. By extending the break/roll line a collar construction can be added. A version of this is the shawl collar, where the collar extends from the fabric of the garment on to the lapel without being sewn on.

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The measurement of the neckline on the pattern has to be taken in order to construct a collar. Therefore, if the neckline is to be changed according to the design, do this before cutting the collar pattern.

#### 3.1.5 front/back

Assemble and stitch front and back panels

 Assemble and stitch both panels (front and back) along the side seam with lining (left and right)

Method of construction: - stitch and turn

Seam operation: -

- a. Inner seam = 10 mm on lining
- b. Top stitch = 2 mm
- 2. Close lining at side edges (left and right)

Folding allowance for front and back waist band (top) = 10 mm

Seam operation: -

- a. Seam = 10 cm
- b. Press open operation at waist band sides

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


Fig. Front and back panels assembled together

5 best ways to add waistbands to your garment

## Different types of waistbands

Most waistbands do multiple duties in a garment. Other than just holding up a skirt or a pant, or serving as place holders of accessories like bows, they are also eye stoppers – they bring the eyes to the most lean part of your torso. A neat and carefully made waistband is an essential prerequisite to a well tailored outfit. Checkout the different types of waistbands and how to go about adding them easily.

# 1. Straight Waistband

## How to add a basic straight waistband to your dress or skirt

Straight waistbands are classy; there is no question about it. The fitting finish of this waistband makes this one give a slim look to the whole silhouette. They will be fitting

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smugly at the waist and make the whole garment look the best. It is a perfect finish for fitted garments. The most popular straight waistband width is 1.5 inches though I have sewn ones which are 1 inch and more than 2 inches as well. Checkout the pattern /sewing tutorial for pencil skirt for sewing a waistband of this type

One of the most important criteria for getting a good looking waistband is to **interface** it. You can use a fusible interfacing of medium weight. Either interface the whole waistband fabric or cut the interfacing to the width and length of the dimensions of the final waistband you want. In the second instance the seam allowance is done away with and hence no added bulk when sewing the seams of the waistband.

#### How to attach the waistband to the skirt

When attaching the waistband to a skirt, stitch the waistband to the skirt after the skirt is finished, including gathers, pleats, darts and tucks, zipper is attached, or opening finished with a turn under finish or facing.

- Cut out the waistband pieces
- Length of the waistband = top edge of the skirt piece + 1" seam allowance ( + 1" overlap if you want an overlap for attaching fasteners like hooks, buttons etc) width of fabric piece = 4 1/4 inch for a 1.5 inch waistband
- Adhere the interfacing to the waistband piece to the wrong side of the waistband piece
- Keep the waistband piece on the skirt waist edge, right sides together. Keep the seam allowance extended at both ends, as well as the overlap.
- Overlap would be extending past the edge
- Join the waistband and the skirt waist along the long edge. Do not forget to back stitch at the start and ending
- Press the 1/2 inch seam allowance of the other long edge to the inside with a medium hot iron.

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- Press the waistband by almost half right sides together (almost half means less than 1/4 inch more than half, so that when we machine stitch from the top, the edge on the back will be caught in the stitching line correctly.)You can also hand stitch the edges using whip stitches
- Stitch the side edges at both ends with a 1/2 inch seam allowance.
- Trim the corner and the seam allowance
- Turn the waistband right side out. Pull out the corners with a sharp pointed object;
   You need square corners
- On the wrong side of the skirt, the folded edge will be overlapping the seam line, even extending a little bit. Pin the whole waistband in place with the folded under edge
- Top stitch, stitch in the ditch from the top along the seam line. The turned under edge at the back will be neatly caught in this stitching now.

## 2. Facing waistband

Adding a facing waistband can give a seamless and neat finish to the waist area,. You will have a very smooth skirt edge without any separate waistband. It is better if the facing is made with a lightweight fabric. Checkout the sewing tutorial for a straight skirt with yoke with the faced waistband for how to sew this type of waistband with a zipper and also the post on drafting and sewing facing to fabric edges

#### 3. Stretch Waistbands

The two main types of elastic waistbands are self-waistband which uses a tuned under finish to create the casing for elastic and separate waistband which uses a separate strip of fabric to create the waist band. You can also use wide decorative elastic directly as a waistband without a casing. Then there is shirring which is used to gather the fabric at the waist. A stretch paper bag waistband is a variation of

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the elastic waistband. Checkout the post on different ways of sewing elastic waistbands for more details

#### 4. Drawstring waistbands

A drawstring waistband is very similar to the turned under waistband. It is basically made by just turning under the waist fabric edge and makes a casing for a drawstring cord which will tighten the loose waist of the garment. Eyelets or buttonholes are added for the cord to pass through. Checkout the tutorial for a drawstring lounge pants for sewing instructions for a drawstring waistband (separate) or sewing instructions for salwar pants for a turn under drawstring waistband.

How to make a drawstring waistband

#### Step 1

Two buttonholes have to be sewn on the either side of the center front of the waistband for the drawstring to pass through. You can use eyelet holes instead of buttonholes. Metal grommets are very easy to apply on clothes. Checkout the tutorial to make different types of eyelet holes including metal eyelets. These holes has to be completed before making the casing

Mark the folding line of the upper edge of the casing. After you have marked the center front, mark buttonholes 1/2 inch to either side of the center front right on the casing. Finish the buttonholes or eyelets

#### Step2

Fold the fabric edge twice, to the inside, Pin in place. Stitch the casing along the folded edge.

Top stitch the top edge of the casing as well; so that there is a channel for the drawstring cord to pass through

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# Step 3

Cut a length of cord Length of the cord should be 30 inch added to the hip round measure You can use shop bought cord or simple fabric tubes made using the tutorial found here

#### Step 4

Insert the cord / tube through the casing with the help of a pin. You can join the ends of cords or tie knots at the end of the cord or make cord stoppers like the ones in this gift bag tutorial to prevent the drawstring from slipping outside the casing.

# 5. Wrap around waistband

Checkout this wrap skirt tutorial to see this kind of waistband which is a very comfortable and casual one because this waistband is as fitting as you seem fit. It is how you tie it that make or break it. You can also use a button fastening with a wrap around waistband.

#### 3.1.7 Pockets

Pockets should be functional, so try to create pockets that are large enough to put a hand in. Remember that men's hands are larger than women's. Some tailors add a pleat in the centre of the inside pocket bag to allow for shaped objects, such as keys, to go inside the pocket bag without pulling and showing a stretch mark on the jacket outside.

The position of the pocket on the garment is very important. Not only is it a focus point, it also needs to be easily accessed. The best way to find the pocket position is to fit the garment on a life model and ask him or her to point out a comfortable position for the pocket mouth. When grading a garment with pockets, make sure to grade the pocket within natural proportions.

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When using slant, continental or side seam pockets in trousers, make sure to continue the pocket bag into the centre front zip fly. This method will keep the pocket bags in place and create a nice finish in the inside of the garment. When constructing welt or jetted pockets in the back of trousers or skirts, sew the pocket bag into the waistband for stability. The pocket mouth (this is the part where the pocket is worked in) should always be secured through an interlining.

Inside pockets sometimes have buttons to enable the pocket bag to be closed. Cover the button up with a triangular piece of lining, to avoid the button leaving marks on garments worn under the jacket. It also prevents the button from being caught in the garment underneath. Go around twice when you stitch up the pocket bag and use a small stitch (2–2.5mm) for extra strength.

Assemble and stitch the facing part and front lining together

Method of construction: - stitch and turn

Seam operation: -

- Inside seam = 10 mm

- Over seam = 2mm

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


Fig. facing assembled and stitched to lining

#### 3.2 Attaching paddings to lining components

Padding a garment helps to emphasize parts of the body, to add shape and support or it can simply make a fashion statement. Padding involves creating a tunnel or shape, which then can be stuffed with lamb's wool, polyester fleece, cotton batting or armo wool. One early example of an exceptional use of padding is an evening dress by Elsa Schiaparelli (1890–1973), a designer with a strong interest in surrealism. The dress is a black skeleton evening gown, with a padded representation of human bones. Christian Dior also created exceptional padded designs with his New Look collection. Here, he created pads to emphasize the hip Christian Dior also created exceptional padded designs with his New Look collection. Here, he created pads to emphasize the hip for a stronger feminine look. Modern designers Victor & Rolf showed an experimental way of using padded sculptured pieces with garments draped on top in their 1998/1999 Autumn/Winter collection. The beauty of the concept was that all the clothes could be worn with or without the padded pieces.

Padding can also be used in hemlines, to soften and add weight and body to a hem. The advantage of a well-padded hem is that it provides protection from over pressing and keeps its softness for the lifetime of the garment.

A shoulder pad is used to define the shoulder area and create a smooth appearance over the shoulder and collarbone. Pads are used between the garment fabric and the lining, or covered pads can be used inside the garment on the shoulder. Shoulder pads come in different sizes and shapes. Depending on the sleeve design, there are several shapes available. For example, the tailored pad is triangular and made from layers of wadding sandwiched between felt, which is then loosely stitched together. The tailored

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pads used in women's and men's jackets or coats are approximately 1–1.5cm high over the shoulder point. The height can be customized and layers can be added to accommodate a different look. Pads are also available for raglan sleeves – a raglan sleeve has a much softer appearance and therefore the pad is an oval shape. The tailored pad used in a set-in sleeve is cut off at the end of the shoulder to create a strong and square appearance whereas the raglan shoulder pad runs along the shoulder and into the sleeve for a softer look. Regular pads can be bought readymade in haberdashery shops or, for a better result, can be created from scratch using the pattern of the garment so that the fit and form are perfect. Designers have to consider the extra costs when using a bespoke shoulder pad but such costs are likely to be counterbalanced by the creation of a better, perhaps more exciting silhouette.

During the 1980s and early 1990s shoulder pads were especially popular with fashion designers. Garments such as blouses and jersey pieces were available with detachable pads. Growing up in the 1980s, women would fill their accessory drawers with different sizes and shapes of shoulder pads that could then be added under all kinds of outfits.




Fig. lining sleeve assembled to the body lining

- b. Top stitch = 2 mm




Fig. assembled front panels

- b. Top stitch = 2 mm

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


Fig. assembled back panels




Fig. back waist band with back panels

Assemble and stitch lining

Prepare pocket of front lining

 Prepare double piping with zip for right side of the pocket and Single pipe without zip for left side of the pocket.

  - Over seam 2mm




Fig. Pocket preparation on sleeve

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


Fig. facing assembled and stitched to lining

# I. Assemble lining with the panels

- 2. Assemble and stitch lining with back panel
- 3. Join and stitch the front and back lining together at the side
- Seam operation: Inner seam = 1cm





Fig. Front and back lining

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


Fig. Front and back panels with lining

• Seam operation: - Over seam = 2mm & 4mm parallel

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


Fig. left and right panels stitched together

Over seam = 2 mm and 4 mm parallel

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


Fig. Front and back panels stitched together

To ensure product quality department wise checkpoints has been described by the following chart.

# 3.6 conducting first fitting on the dummy and necessary changes made, if required

When preparing for a dummy fitting some parts of the garment can be hand sewn, for example, the sleeve into the armhole. The rest of the dummy should be sewn together with a bigger machine stitch (3–4mm), as it is easier to unpick the dummy after the fitting if necessary. Mark all the lines necessary for a fitting, for example centre front and back, waist and hip line, and elbow line. These lines can be marked with a pen or thread. If using shoulder pads, use the same pair as for the final garment. The same applies to any underpinnings such as underskirts and corsetry. The collar can be fitted without an under-collar attached in the first fitting, as it makes it easier to fit for a better shape.

Pocket positions can be drawn on in the fitting. It is easier to find the right position with the live model as they can attempt to put his or her hands into the pocket. If pocket flaps or patch pockets are used, cut out shapes of the sample garment ready to be pinned on in the fitting. # 3.7 Assessing second fitting of garments

Any alterations that have been made since the first fitting will be revisited in the second fitting. The detailing will be looked at and discussed. Decisions about finishes such as binding or top-stitching are finalized. Once everyone is happy with the fit, the garment can be cut out in the final leather and a shell fitting can take place. The shell fitting enables the designer to see how the final leather behaves on the body. As such, the garment is only very basically constructed. The seams are not cleaned up and facings and lining are not yet attached. If necessary, small alterations can still take place at this stage. Sometimes more than one or two dummy fittings take place, especially on new shape developments. Fittings are time-consuming and cost money but they are necessary for a well-proportioned and well-fitting garment.




Fig. 1:1 front and back view of short skirt

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


Fig. 1:2 fusing plan of short skirt pieces

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


Fig. 1:3 fusing width

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


Fig. 1:4 assembled front panels




Fig. 1:5 front waist band with front panels

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


Fig. 1:6 hem folding at bottom of skirt




Fig. 1:7 assembled back panels

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


Fig. 1:8 back waist band with back panels




Fig. 1:9 front and back panels assembled together




Fig. 1:10 folds at zip and hem

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


Fig. 1:11 lining assembled with waist band facing

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



Fig. 1:12 joining left and right lining




Fig. 1:14 back lining assembled with back panels




Fig. 1:15 front and back panels assembled together

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


Fig. 1:16 assembled zip at center front




Fig. 2:2 back view of jacket

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


Fig. 2:3 fusing plan of jacket components

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


Fig. 2:4 single piping pocket preparation

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


Fig. 2:6 double and single piping pocket preparation on front panels




Fig. 2:7 front yoke fold




Fig. 2:8 joining the folded front yoke panel to the front panel

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


Fig. 2:9 folding the edge of back panels




Fig. 2:10 joining and stitching at center front

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


Fig. 2:11 back yoke fold




Fig. 2:12 joining and stitching back yoke to the back panels




Fig. 2:13 assembling front and back panels at shoulder

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


Fig. 2:14 assembling sleeve components

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


Fig. 2:15 stitching sleeve components

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


Fig. 2:16 joining and stitching sleeve to the panels (front and back)




Fig. 2:17 folding top collar and collar facing

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



Fig. 2:19 assembling and stitching collar to body




Fig. 2:21 facing assembled and stitched to lining

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


Fig. 2:22 front and back lining assembled together

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



Fig. 3:2 back view of men's jacket

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


Fig. 3:3 fusing plan of jacket components

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


Fig. 3: 4 double piping pocket




Fig. 3:5 placing pocket lining on bottom piping

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


Fig. 3:6 fixing the pocket facing




Fig. 3:7 pocket over seam




Fig. 3:8 pocket fold




Fig. 3:9 pocket flap




Fig. 3:10 waist band fold

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


Fig. 3:11 pocket and flap on the panel stitched on panel




Fig. 3:12 front top and bottom panels stitched together




Fig. 3:13 back panels stitched together




Fig. 3:13 back panels and yoke stitched together

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


Fig. 3:15 back waist band fold




Fig. 3:16 bottom panels stitched together

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


Fig. 3:17 back top and bottom panels stitched together

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


Fig. 3:18 stitched sleeve pieces

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


Fig. 3:19 sleeves stitched to the panel




Fig. 3: 20 collar preparation

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


Fig. 3:21 mounted blanket




Fig. 4:1 front view of ladies tailored jacket

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


Fig. 4:2 back view of ladies tailored jacket

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


Fig. 4:4 fusing plan of ladies jacket pieces

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



Fig. 4: 5 button holes




Fig. 4:7 front and back panels stitched together

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


Fig. 4:8 sleeve




Fig. 4:9 sleeves mounted on the body




Fig. 4:10 collar




Fig. 4:11 facing stitched to lining

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


Fig. 4:12 lining sleeve assembled to the body lining




Fig. 5: front and back view of pant

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


Fig. 5:2 fusing plan of pant components

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


Fig. 5:3 back pocket fold




Fig. 5:4 upper panel fold




Fig. 5:5 pocket and upper panel stitched back panel




Fig. 5:6 front pocket preparation

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


Fig. 5:7 zip attachment

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



Fig. 5:8 front and back lining

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


Fig. 5:9 lining assembled to the panel




Fig. 5:11 left and right panels stitched together




Fig. 5:12 front and back panels stitched together




Fig. 5:13 fixing waist band to the panels




Fig. 1:1 front and back view of short skirt

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


Fig. 1:2 fusing plan of short skirt pieces

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


Fig. 1:3 fusing width

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


Fig. 1:4 assembled front panels




Fig. 1:5 front waist band with front panels

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


Fig. 1:6 hem folding at bottom of skirt




Fig. 1:7 assembled back panels

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


Fig. 1:8 back waist band with back panels




Fig. 1:9 front and back panels assembled together




Fig. 1:10 folds at zip and hem

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


Fig. 1:11 lining assembled with waist band facing

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



Fig. 1:12 joining left and right lining




Fig. 1:14 back lining assembled with back panels




Fig. 1:15 front and back panels assembled together

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


Fig. 1:16 assembled zip at center front




Fig. 2:2 back view of jacket

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


Fig. 2:3 fusing plan of jacket components

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


Fig. 2:4 single piping pocket preparation

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


Fig. 2:6 double and single piping pocket preparation on front panels




Fig. 2:7 front yoke fold




Fig. 2:8 joining the folded front yoke panel to the front panel

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


Fig. 2:9 folding the edge of back panels




Fig. 2:10 joining and stitching at center front

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


Fig. 2:11 back yoke fold




Fig. 2:12 joining and stitching back yoke to the back panels




Fig. 2:13 assembling front and back panels at shoulder

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


Fig. 2:14 assembling sleeve components

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


Fig. 2:15 stitching sleeve components

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


Fig. 2:16 joining and stitching sleeve to the panels (front and back)




Fig. 2:17 folding top collar and collar facing

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



Fig. 2:19 assembling and stitching collar to body




Fig. 2:21 facing assembled and stitched to lining

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


Fig. 2:22 front and back lining assembled together




Fig. 3:1 front view of men's jacket

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



Fig. 3:2 back view of men's jacket

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


Fig. 3:3 fusing plan of jacket components

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


Fig. 3: 4 double piping pocket




Fig. 3:5 placing pocket lining on bottom piping

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


Fig. 3:6 fixing the pocket facing




Fig. 3:7 pocket over seam




Fig. 3:8 pocket fold




Fig. 3:9 pocket flap




Fig. 3:10 waist band fold

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


Fig. 3:11 pocket and flap on the panel stitched on panel




Fig. 3:12 front top and bottom panels stitched together




Fig. 3:13 back panels stitched together




Fig. 3:13 back panels and yoke stitched together

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


Fig. 3:15 back waist band fold




Fig. 3:16 bottom panels stitched together

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


Fig. 3:17 back top and bottom panels stitched together

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


Fig. 3:18 stitched sleeve pieces

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


Fig. 3:19 sleeves stitched to the panel




Fig. 3: 20 collar preparation

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


Fig. 3:21 mounted blanket

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


Fig. 4:2 back view of ladies tailored jacket

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


Fig. 4:4 fusing plan of ladies jacket pieces

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



Fig. 4: 5 button holes




Fig. 4:7 front and back panels stitched together

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


Fig. 4:8 sleeve




Fig. 4:9 sleeves mounted on the body




Fig. 4:10 collar




Fig. 4:11 facing stitched to lining

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


Fig. 4:12 lining sleeve assembled to the body lining




Fig. 5: front and back view of pant

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



Fig. 5:2 fusing plan of pant components




Fig. 5:4 upper panel fold

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


Fig. 5:5 pocket and upper panel stitched back panel

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


Fig. 5:6 front pocket preparation

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


Fig. 5:7 zip attachment

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



Fig. 5:8 front and back lining

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


Fig. 5:9 lining assembled to the panel




Fig. 5:11 left and right panels stitched together




Fig. 5:12 front and back panels stitched together




Fig. 5:13 fixing waist band to the panels

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


Fig. 6:1 front view of men's hooded jacket

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



Fig. 6:2 back view of men's hooded jacket




Fig. 6:4 top front panel




Fig. 6:5 prepared hood

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


Fig. 6:6 collar and hood fixed to the neck

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


Fig. 1:1 front and back view of short skirt

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


Fig. 1:2 fusing plan of short skirt pieces

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


Fig. 1:3 fusing width

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


Fig. 1:4 assembled front panels




Fig. 1:5 front waist band with front panels

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


Fig. 1:6 hem folding at bottom of skirt




Fig. 1:7 assembled back panels

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


Fig. 1:8 back waist band with back panels




Fig. 1:9 front and back panels assembled together




Fig. 1:10 folds at zip and hem

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


Fig. 1:11 lining assembled with waist band facing

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



Fig. 1:12 joining left and right lining




Fig. 1:14 back lining assembled with back panels




Fig. 1:15 front and back panels assembled together

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


Fig. 1:16 assembled zip at center front




Fig. 2:2 back view of jacket

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


Fig. 2:3 fusing plan of jacket components

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


Fig. 2:4 single piping pocket preparation

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


Fig. 2:6 double and single piping pocket preparation on front panels




Fig. 2:7 front yoke fold




Fig. 2:8 joining the folded front yoke panel to the front panel

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


Fig. 2:9 folding the edge of back panels




Fig. 2:10 joining and stitching at center front

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


Fig. 2:11 back yoke fold




Fig. 2:12 joining and stitching back yoke to the back panels




Fig. 2:13 assembling front and back panels at shoulder

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


Fig. 2:14 assembling sleeve components

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


Fig. 2:15 stitching sleeve components

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


Fig. 2:16 joining and stitching sleeve to the panels (front and back)




Fig. 2:17 folding top collar and collar facing

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



Fig. 2:19 assembling and stitching collar to body




Fig. 2:21 facing assembled and stitched to lining

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


Fig. 2:22 front and back lining assembled together




Fig. 3:1 front view of men's jacket

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



Fig. 3:2 back view of men's jacket

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


Fig. 3:3 fusing plan of jacket components

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


Fig. 3: 4 double piping pocket




Fig. 3:5 placing pocket lining on bottom piping

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


Fig. 3:6 fixing the pocket facing




Fig. 3:7 pocket over seam




Fig. 3:8 pocket fold




Fig. 3:9 pocket flap




Fig. 3:10 waist band fold

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


Fig. 3:11 pocket and flap on the panel stitched on panel




Fig. 3:12 front top and bottom panels stitched together




Fig. 3:13 back panels stitched together




Fig. 3:13 back panels and yoke stitched together

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


Fig. 3:15 back waist band fold




Fig. 3:16 bottom panels stitched together

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


Fig. 3:17 back top and bottom panels stitched together

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


Fig. 3:18 stitched sleeve pieces

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


Fig. 3:19 sleeves stitched to the panel




Fig. 3: 20 collar preparation

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


Fig. 3:21 mounted blanket




Fig. 4:1 front view of ladies tailored jacket

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


Fig. 4:2 back view of ladies tailored jacket

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


Fig. 4:4 fusing plan of ladies jacket pieces

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



Fig. 4: 5 button holes




Fig. 4:7 front and back panels stitched together

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


Fig. 4:8 sleeve




Fig. 4:9 sleeves mounted on the body




Fig. 4:10 collar




Fig. 4:11 facing stitched to lining

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


Fig. 4:12 lining sleeve assembled to the body lining




Fig. 5: front and back view of pant

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



Fig. 5:2 fusing plan of pant components




Fig. 5:4 upper panel fold

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


Fig. 5:5 pocket and upper panel stitched back panel

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


Fig. 5:6 front pocket preparation

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


Fig. 5:7 zip attachment

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



Fig. 5:8 front and back lining

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


Fig. 5:9 lining assembled to the panel




Fig. 5:11 left and right panels stitched together




Fig. 5:12 front and back panels stitched together




Fig. 5:13 fixing waist band to the panels

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


Fig. 6:1 front view of men's hooded jacket

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



Fig. 6:2 back view of men's hooded jacket




Fig. 6:4 top front panel




Fig. 6:5 prepared hood

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


Fig. 1:1 front and back view of short skirt

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


Fig. 1:2 fusing plan of short skirt pieces

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


Fig. 1:3 fusing width

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


Fig. 1:4 assembled front panels




Fig. 1:5 front waist band with front panels

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


Fig. 1:6 hem folding at bottom of skirt




Fig. 1:7 assembled back panels

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


Fig. 1:8 back waist band with back panels




Fig. 1:9 front and back panels assembled together




Fig. 1:10 folds at zip and hem

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


Fig. 1:11 lining assembled with waist band facing

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



Fig. 1:12 joining left and right lining




Fig. 1:14 back lining assembled with back panels




Fig. 1:15 front and back panels assembled together

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


Fig. 1:16 assembled zip at center front




Fig. 2:2 back view of jacket

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


Fig. 2:3 fusing plan of jacket components

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


Fig. 2:4 single piping pocket preparation

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


Fig. 2:6 double and single piping pocket preparation on front panels




Fig. 2:7 front yoke fold




Fig. 2:8 joining the folded front yoke panel to the front panel

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


Fig. 2:9 folding the edge of back panels




Fig. 2:10 joining and stitching at center front

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


Fig. 2:11 back yoke fold




Fig. 2:12 joining and stitching back yoke to the back panels




Fig. 2:13 assembling front and back panels at shoulder

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


Fig. 2:14 assembling sleeve components

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


Fig. 2:15 stitching sleeve components

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


Fig. 2:16 joining and stitching sleeve to the panels (front and back)




Fig. 2:17 folding top collar and collar facing

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


Fig. 2:19 assembling and stitching collar to body






Fig. 2:21 facing assembled and stitched to lining

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


Fig. 2:22 front and back lining assembled together




Fig. 3:1 front view of men's jacket

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



Fig. 3:2 back view of men's jacket

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


Fig. 3:3 fusing plan of jacket components

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


Fig. 3: 4 double piping pocket




Fig. 3:5 placing pocket lining on bottom piping

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


Fig. 3:6 fixing the pocket facing




Fig. 3:7 pocket over seam




Fig. 3:8 pocket fold




Fig. 3:9 pocket flap




Fig. 3:10 waist band fold

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


Fig. 3:11 pocket and flap on the panel stitched on panel




Fig. 3:12 front top and bottom panels stitched together




Fig. 3:13 back panels stitched together




Fig. 3:13 back panels and yoke stitched together

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


Fig. 3:15 back waist band fold




Fig. 3:16 bottom panels stitched together

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


Fig. 3:17 back top and bottom panels stitched together

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


Fig. 3:18 stitched sleeve pieces

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


Fig. 3:19 sleeves stitched to the panel




Fig. 3: 20 collar preparation

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


Fig. 3:21 mounted blanket

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


Fig. 4:2 back view of ladies tailored jacket

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


Fig. 4:4 fusing plan of ladies jacket pieces

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



Fig. 4: 5 button holes




Fig. 4:7 front and back panels stitched together

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


Fig. 4:8 sleeve




Fig. 4:9 sleeves mounted on the body




Fig. 4:10 collar




Fig. 4:11 facing stitched to lining

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


Fig. 4:12 lining sleeve assembled to the body lining




Fig. 5: front and back view of pant

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



Fig. 5:2 fusing plan of pant components




Fig. 5:4 upper panel fold

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


Fig. 5:5 pocket and upper panel stitched back panel

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


Fig. 5:6 front pocket preparation

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


Fig. 5:7 zip attachment

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



Fig. 5:8 front and back lining

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


Fig. 5:9 lining assembled to the panel




Fig. 5:11 left and right panels stitched together




Fig. 5:12 front and back panels stitched together




Fig. 5:13 fixing waist band to the panels

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


Fig. 6:1 front view of men's hooded jacket

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



Fig. 6:2 back view of men's hooded jacket




Fig. 6:4 top front panel




Fig. 6:5 prepared hood

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


Fig. 1:1 front and back view of short skirt

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


Fig. 1:2 fusing plan of short skirt pieces

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


Fig. 1:3 fusing width

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


Fig. 1:4 assembled front panels




Fig. 1:5 front waist band with front panels

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


Fig. 1:6 hem folding at bottom of skirt




Fig. 1:7 assembled back panels

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


Fig. 1:8 back waist band with back panels




Fig. 1:9 front and back panels assembled together




Fig. 1:10 folds at zip and hem

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


Fig. 1:11 lining assembled with waist band facing

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



Fig. 1:12 joining left and right lining




Fig. 1:14 back lining assembled with back panels




Fig. 1:15 front and back panels assembled together

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


Fig. 1:16 assembled zip at center front




Fig. 2:2 back view of jacket

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


Fig. 2:3 fusing plan of jacket components

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


Fig. 2:4 single piping pocket preparation

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


Fig. 2:6 double and single piping pocket preparation on front panels




Fig. 2:7 front yoke fold




Fig. 2:8 joining the folded front yoke panel to the front panel

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


Fig. 2:9 folding the edge of back panels




Fig. 2:10 joining and stitching at center front

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


Fig. 2:11 back yoke fold




Fig. 2:12 joining and stitching back yoke to the back panels




Fig. 2:13 assembling front and back panels at shoulder

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


Fig. 2:14 assembling sleeve components

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


Fig. 2:15 stitching sleeve components

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


Fig. 2:16 joining and stitching sleeve to the panels (front and back)




Fig. 2:17 folding top collar and collar facing

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



Fig. 2:19 assembling and stitching collar to body




Fig. 2:21 facing assembled and stitched to lining

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


Fig. 2:22 front and back lining assembled together




Fig. 3:1 front view of men's jacket

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



Fig. 3:2 back view of men's jacket

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


Fig. 3:3 fusing plan of jacket components

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


Fig. 3: 4 double piping pocket




Fig. 3:5 placing pocket lining on bottom piping

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


Fig. 3:6 fixing the pocket facing




Fig. 3:7 pocket over seam




Fig. 3:8 pocket fold




Fig. 3:9 pocket flap




Fig. 3:10 waist band fold

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


Fig. 3:11 pocket and flap on the panel stitched on panel




Fig. 3:12 front top and bottom panels stitched together




Fig. 3:13 back panels stitched together




Fig. 3:13 back panels and yoke stitched together

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


Fig. 3:15 back waist band fold




Fig. 3:16 bottom panels stitched together

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


Fig. 3:17 back top and bottom panels stitched together

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


Fig. 3:18 stitched sleeve pieces

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


Fig. 3:19 sleeves stitched to the panel




Fig. 3: 20 collar preparation

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


Fig. 3:21 mounted blanket

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


Fig. 4:2 back view of ladies tailored jacket

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


Fig. 4:4 fusing plan of ladies jacket pieces

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



Fig. 4: 5 button holes




Fig. 4:7 front and back panels stitched together

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


Fig. 4:8 sleeve




Fig. 4:9 sleeves mounted on the body




Fig. 4:10 collar




Fig. 4:11 facing stitched to lining

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


Fig. 4:12 lining sleeve assembled to the body lining




Fig. 5: front and back view of pant

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



Fig. 5:2 fusing plan of pant components




Fig. 5:4 upper panel fold

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


Fig. 5:5 pocket and upper panel stitched back panel

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


Fig. 5:6 front pocket preparation

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


Fig. 5:7 zip attachment

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



Fig. 5:8 front and back lining

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


Fig. 5:9 lining assembled to the panel




Fig. 5:11 left and right panels stitched together




Fig. 5:12 front and back panels stitched together




Fig. 5:13 fixing waist band to the panels

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


Fig. 6:1 front view of men's hooded jacket

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



Fig. 6:2 back view of men's hooded jacket

### ASSEMBLING AND STITCHING PROCEDURE OF HOODED JACKET

- 61. Perform fusing operation according to the operation sheet 3
- 62. Assemble and stitch front panels

  Prepare single pipe pocket on both side of the front top panels (*Refer Operation Sheet 2: Procedure II: 1.*)
- 63. Assemble and stitch front top panels

  Seam Operation: over seam = 2 mm and 4 mm parallel




Fig. 6:4 top front panel

- 64. Assemble and stitch bottom front panels together

  Method of construction: press open, inner seam = 1 cm
- 65. Prepare hole for rope on bottom front panel on the proper position as shown on sketch
- 66. Assemble and stitch pocket and flap on panel (*Refer Operation Sheet 3: Procedure II:*2.)
- 67. Assemble and stitch top and bottom panels together

  Seam operation: Over seam = 2 mm and 4 mm parallel
- 68. Assemble and stitch back panels (Refer Operation Sheet 3: Procedure III.)
- 69. Assembling and stitching sleeve (Refer Operation Sheet 3: Procedure IV.)
- 70. Mount sleeve (left and right) (Refer Operation Sheet 3: Procedure V.)

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- 71. Mount shoulder pad
- 72. Prepare of collar and mount it (*Refer operation sheet 2: VIII.*)
- 73. Assemble and stitch hood
  - Assemble side panels (left and right) to the center panel using double sided adhesive tape
  - Stitch the panels together

Method of construction: - stitch and turn

Seam operation: - inner seam = 1 cm, over seam = 2 mm

• Assemble and stitch facing and lining together

Method of construction: - stitch and turn

Seam operation: -inner seam = 1 cm, over seam = 2 mm on lining

- Assemble and stitch lining to the prepared hood panels
- Prepare the holes through which the rope pass
- Pass the rope through the prepared hole




Fig. 6:5 prepared hood

- 74. Fix collar and prepared hood together by double side adhesive tape
- 75. Join the assembled collar and hood to the neck

Seam operation: - 1 cm inner seam

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


Fig. 6:6 collar and hood fixed to the neck

- 76. Assemble and stitch lining (Refer Operation sheet 2: X.)
- 77. Prepare cuff and mount it on sleeve (Refer operation sheet 3: X.)
- 78. Assemble and stitch zip fastener at center front
  - Insert the zip in between the folded center front panel and facing
  - Seam operation: 6 mm from edge
- 79. Prepare and mount the blanket (*Refer operation sheet 3: XII.*)
- 80. Finish the process
  - Trim excess threads
  - Remove the excess adhesive using crepe rubber and chalk mark on leather
