Defect locations on the leather, color and thickness of leather required for the product to be made

- > Shoulder: second best quality next to butt
- > Neck: part with growth marks
- Belly: the poorest in quality
- Shank: stretchy with wrinkles

- 3. <u>Ans</u>. Full grain has had nothing done to alert the natural makings of the hide/skin. But corrected grain is made to be even grain covering defects
- 4. <u>Ans</u>.
 - > Poor slaughter
